Thanks to all who participated in the recent CFM elections. It is important for all of us to participate in such an important process. On a personal note, thank you for your support of me as your Vice-President, Delegate and our ticket. I am honored to serve our membership.

I also want to wish you all Happy Holidays throughout this season. I hope you have a chance to gather with friends, family and loved ones while sharing food, music and fellowship.

A new CBA has been ratified for the Lake Forest Symphony. The agreement achieved increases in wages over the three years of the agreement, as well as improvements in working conditions and work rules. The negotiating committee for the Lake Forest Symphony did a great job presenting the orchestra's desires for the contract. Congratulations to the orchestra and their committee.

A new CBA was negotiated and ratified for the Illinois Philharmonic Orchestra. They achieved good increases in their wages, working conditions and addressed many of the proposals from the orchestra. They also ratified the Integrated Media Agreement, an AFM negotiated agreement covering capture and use of electronic media in symphonies with CBA's. Their committee did a great job bringing to the table the concerns of the orchestra. Congratulations to all at the IPO.

Dean Rolando and I attended Christ The King High School's career day in early November. This is a yearly event for the CFM, this being our 5th year. The school hosts professionals to appear before students who are interested in that profession. We talked about careers in music and the expectations associated with being a professional in those careers. We also talk about how the union helps support professional musicians. It is important for us as professional musicians and as a union to interact with these young musicians.

In late October the CFM hosted Norman Ludwin, a professional bassist performing in film orchestras, who also works as an orchestrator, composer and instructor in Los Angeles. Our hope was to have Norman present clinics on orchestration at area universities, giving the students valuable insight into film scoring and an introduction to the CFM/AFM. The CFM arranged to bring Norman into Chicago and Dean Rolando went with Norm to the universities to bring the CFM/AFM into the discussions. This was a very successful project and served as a great source of information to these young musicians, not only about this part of our business, but also about our union.

CFM Hosts Dr. Norman Ludwin

In late October, the CFM invited Dr. Norman Ludwin to Chicago. Norman is a busy film session bassist in Los Angeles CA and is an orchestrator, arranger and composer as well as a renown instructor in those areas. Norman has presented lectures throughout North America, Asia and Europe covering orchestration, arranging and composition. He is an instructor in the UCLA Extension Film Music Department and at the Professional Musicians Local 47, where he teaches orchestration and computer notation. He is the adjunct instructor for double bass at Claremont University and teaches double bass at the Claremont Community School of Music. He has worked on several recent features including the films *Up, Star Trek 2009* and *Spiderman 3*. He plays regularly on the TV shows *Fringe* and *Lost*.

Norman's compositions have been performed by a variety of groups worldwide, including recent performances by the Colburn School Orchestra de Camera, the Peninsula Symphony, the California State University at Long Beach Symphony, the Orchestra of the Humanities, the Lisbon Municipal Orchestra, the Pacific Composers Forum, the Debussy Trio, and at the Britt Music Festival. He has released two CDs of his own chamber music, and his music publishing company, Ludwin Music, is the world's largest catalogue of double bass music with over 300 titles.

The CFM invited Norman to Chicago to present clinics on composition and orchestration within the film industry and share his knowledge with musicians who might be interested in this area. Besides showing the process, from what he receives from the composer to the finished recording, he also talked about the expectations within that field. The expectation of quick results, knowledge of instruments and

the ability to provide what the composer wants, quickly. He presented a lecture in the Ed Ward Hall as well as at DePaul University, Columbia College and Elmhurst College. All the clinics were well attended and the students at these institutions were very interested to hear from an orchestrator who is active in the business. Many students today are interested in this area and Norman is an expert in this field as well as being articulate and personable in his presentation.

The reason the CFM decided to move forward to present these types of events particularly at major music schools is the need to make young musicians aware of our Union. Young musicians need to be introduced to the American Federation of Musicians. They need to see that we are trying to look out for the good of all those working in this field and that we are musicians (just like them) who have done this work and supported our families with the help of those agreements negotiated by our Union. We are looking to increase the CFM's presence to young musicians: that is why we invited him. We will continue to look for other presentations and events that will further that goal.



Martin J. Fako 1940-2019

Martin John Fako, 79, a 60-year member of the CFM Local 10-208, passed away on October 12, 2019. A resident of Elmhurst for 51 years, he and his family spent their summers in their home on Green Lake at Interlochen, Michigan. Beloved husband of Nancy (Jordan) for 56 years, he was the loving father of Lisa (Peter Brusen) Fako, Laura (Michael) Utley, Nancy (Randy) Hoekstra, Margaret (Michael Slawnik) Fako and Robert Fako, and grandfather of Olivia, Valerie and Caleb Hoekstra, Nancy, Lisa, Peter, and Laura are all members of Local 10-208. Marty was born and raised on the Southside of Chicago. After high school he attended DePaul University, eventually receiving a Masters' Degree in Trombone Performance.



During this time, he also played in the Civic Orchestra of Chicago, the training orchestra of the Chicago Symphony. One of his first professional jobs was with the Chicago Symphony and Fritz Reiner for the recording of Respighi's *Pines and Fountains* of Rome. He also played numerous musical shows and was in the Florida Symphony Orchestra (Orlando) for two seasons.

It was in Civic and in Florida that he became acquainted

with Nancy Jordan, to whom he was married for 56 years. His professional career was interrupted for three years in 1963 when he participated in various musical units of the US Army. He always said he defended his country with his trombone. Shortly after being discharged from the army, he was hired by Lyric Opera of Chicago, where he performed for 28 years. For 37 years he was on the summer faculty of the Interlochen Center for the Arts, and for almost 50 years he maintained his own piano tuning business. Marty was also a gifted photographer, producing thousands of artistic photos that he developed and printed in his home darkroom. He will be sorely missed by the Chicago and Interlochen musical communities.

Section X, C.

Members contracting for single engagements shall pay all monies due to performing members for services within eight (8) days from the date of the engagement. On engagements of more that one (1) week, on a weekly basis, final payment must be made not later that four (4) days from the termination of engagement. Leaders or engaging member failing to comply with the requirements of this paragraph, shall, upon conviction, be fined, suspended or expelled.

(For non CBA orchestras, musicians must be paid within eight (8) days of the last performance in a rehearsal/performance cycle.)

THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS!

Section VIII, G. !. of the CFM By-Laws:

On all engagements, whether single or steady, all contracts must be executed upon the appropriate contract form of the Chicago Federation of Musicians and filed with the Secretary-Treasurer prior to the commencement of the engagement.

CFM Bylans do not allow auditioning of members without consent of the Board of Directors and if approved by the Board members must be paid for the approved audition. See CFM Bylans, Section VIII, letter E numbers 3 & 4.

Playing Gratis (VIII, A.S.)

Members desiring to offer their services gratis must obtain permission from the Board of Directors by sending a written request.




